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FOREWORD

Lingaya's Vidyapeeth is a renowned educational institution dedicated to nurturing young minds and empowering them with knowledge, skills, and values. Established in the year 1998, our institution has a rich history of academic excellence and a commitment to fostering holistic development in students.

The journey of Lingaya's Vidyapeeth began with a vision to provide quality education and contribute to societal advancement by producing leaders, innovators, and responsible citizens. Over the years, we have grown into a comprehensive university, offering a wide range of undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programs across various disciplines.

Lingaya's Vidyapeeth is committed to promoting gender equity and creating a safe and inclusive environment for all students and staff members. This policy outlines the measures that the Vidyapeeth has taken to achieve this goal.

Higher education campuses have a special role in promoting gender equity between women and men. Gender responsive activities under a university wide gender program includes gender sensitisation along with addressal of any imbalances among students and staff in terms of student enrolment, employment, and retention. This policy is an outcome of the belief of the stakeholders to recognize gender concerns as an important issue on the development agenda at national, regional and international levels. The success of the gender policy is the responsibility of all people at policy, decision making and implementation levels of Lingaya's Vidyapeeth.

Lingaya's Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University) fraternity is striving towards non-discrimination of any kind based on gender differentiation or any other factor like caste, race, nationality etc. The gender policy provides guidelines and frameworks for creation of a gender just environment of learning.

INTRODUCTION

Community engagement is a significant aspect of liberal education and experiential learning in Lingaya's Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University). It provides the critical connection with the real world. Lingaya's Vidyapeeth works with the motto to ensure that the relevance of Gender Equity and Equality is accepted in the overall development process of students.

The Government of India also subscribes to and has endorsed a range of international Conventions such as the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights (1962), the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), and Education for All (United Nations Declaration 1990) and the Beijing Declaration (1995) which called for the mainstreaming of gender issues. Hence, it is imperative that the essence and spirit of these declarations become part of day-to-day life particularly in the educational system.

Equity is not maintained where there is discrimination. Discrimination involves treating the genders differently in ways that suggest that one is inherently inferior to the other. Being treated differently in areas of learning and related activities can and does affect the distribution of political, economic and social benefits and influence.

GENDER EQUITY

'Gender' in this policy refers to those behaviours and attitudes which are culturally accepted as appropriate ways of being a woman (femininity) and ways of being man (masculinity). The sex of a person is biologically determined, whereas ways of being a man or women are learned, they are a social construct– they are constructed, reinforced, maintained, and reconstructed over time through social and cultural practices. Such social prescription of gender and gender behaviour vary across cultures, social class, and time. The University Gender Policy attempts to redress the historical gender imbalances that have placed 'women' in a disadvantaged position in accessing, benefiting and getting fair treatment as the users and producers of knowledge. Challenges to self-actualize based on gender differentiation have to be continually addressed consistent with national and international policies on development.

RATIONALE

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), also known as the Global Goals, were adopted by the United Nations in 2015 as a universal call to action to end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure that by 2030 all people enjoy peace and prosperity. The 17 SDGs are integrated, and SDG 5 specifically focusses on gender equality.

Gender discrimination has for long created a culture of exclusion of women and absence of women in higher leadership as well as accessing higher education. The women who make it to the University therefore should not be confronted with gender unfriendly learning and working environment. Measure to address gender inequality cannot take place in vacuum and need participation from all stakeholders in higher education institutions. The various forms of genderbased violence, which can hinder effective participation in learning and working of any member based on gender also needs to identify and corrected with due protocol.

Therefore, the scope of the policy has been designed to encourage all members of society across gender to contribute equally to the University's organisational culture as per cadre, qualifications, and status.

OBJECTIVES

The Gender Equity Promotion Policy of Lingaya's Vidyapeeth aims to achieve the following objectives:

- To promote gender equality and eliminate discrimination based on gender.
- To provide equal opportunities for men and women in all areas, including admissions, scholarships, placements, and promotions.
- To ensure a safe campus environment for women and to prevent and address cases of sexual harassment.
- To increase the representation of women in all areas, including teaching, research, administration, and leadership positions.

APPLICABILITY

This policy is applicable to the students, faculty, and staff of Lingaya's Vidyapeeth. The Workplace Gender Equality and Diversity Policy applies to Lingaya's Vidyapeeth job applicants and to all employees whether full time or part time, temporary or permanent and wherever they are located within Lingaya's Vidyapeeth's offices. It covers:

- a. Recruitment, selection, and promotion
- b. Terms and conditions of employment
- c. Professional development
- d. Flexible working options
- e. Safe working environment
- f. Leadership, management, and accountability
- g. Grievances, disciplinary action, and termination of employment.

SCOPE OF THE POLICY (For Students)

The Gender Equality and Diversity Policy applies to Lingaya's Vidyapeeth students and research scholars whether full time or part time, and wherever they are located within Lingaya's Vidyapeeth's offices.

PRINCIPLES AND VALUES

The higher education system in India encourages, supports and promotes the following values and principles as being essential to the development and implementation of quality curriculum and educational experiences for male and female students.

PRINCIPLES

- All students can achieve their full potential; being either male or females does not determine the capacity to learn.
- Equality of opportunity and outcomes in higher education for female and male students may require that girls and boys get some preferential treatment at least for a period.
- Strategies to improve the quality of education for female students should be based on an understanding that neither men nor women are the same individually or as a group, having different needs and coming from different socio-economic and cultural backgrounds.

VALUES

- Both female and male students should value each other and be valued equally in all aspects of Campus life.
- High quality education for female students as well as for male students is a professional responsibility for all the faculty members, support staff and others involved with academics
- Campus life for girls and boys should reflect the entitlements of all women to personal respect and personal safety, economic security, and participation in and influence over decisions making which affect their lives

POLICY MEASURES

Gender sensitization program: Lingaya's Vidyapeeth organizes workshops, seminars, and training programs to sensitize students and staff members about gender equity and related issues. These programs cover topics such as gender stereotypes, gender-based discrimination, sexual harassment, and gender-inclusive language.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES: Lingaya’s Vidyapeeth provides equal opportunities for men and women in all areas, including admissions, scholarships, placements, and promotions. The Vidyapeeth ensures that the selection process is fair and transparent and that gender is not a criterion for selection.

SAFE CAMPUS: Lingaya’s Vidyapeeth ensures that the campus is safe for women and that there is zero tolerance for sexual harassment. It also organizes awareness campaigns to prevent sexual harassment and promotes gender equity.

GENDER- INCLUSIVE LANGUAGE: Lingaya’s Vidyapeeth encourages the use of gender-inclusive language in all official communications, including its website, brochures, and other publications. It also ensures that all forms and documents are gender-inclusive.

SUPPORT SERVICES: Lingaya’s Vidyapeeth provides support services such as counseling, health services, and legal aid to women students and staff members. It also provides facilities such as hostels and transport services to ensure the safety and comfort of women.

GENDER DIVERSITY: Lingaya’s Vidyapeeth strives to increase the representation of women in all areas, including teaching, research, administration, and leadership positions. It encourages women to apply for these positions and ensures that the selection process is fair and transparent.

Event Objectives	Psychological well-being is a core feature of mental health, and may be defined as including hedonic (enjoyment, pleasure) and eudaimonic (meaning, fulfillment) happiness, as well as resilience (coping, emotion regulation, healthy problem solving). To promote psychological well-being, it is helpful to understand the underlying mechanisms associated with this construct and then develop targeted and effective training programs.
Event Description	The importance of mental health has been increasingly emphasized in recent decades as public awareness and understanding grow. Mental health is now understood to involve both the absence of mental illness and the presence of psychological well-being. Psychological well-being is a complex construct that concerns optimal psychological functioning and experience. It may be defined as including hedonic (enjoyment, pleasure) and eudaimonic (meaning, fulfillment) happiness as well as resilience [coping, emotion regulation, healthy problem solving]. Through this lecture speaker emphasizes on the mental health of the girls students.
Event Outcome	Students' well-being and their success in and outside University depend on their ability to use their competences for democratic culture. Since well-being has many facets, improving students' well-being in schools requires a whole- University approach, involving both teachers and parents.

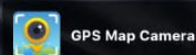

ABOUT THE UNIFORM CIVIL CODE

Uniform Civil Code is the ongoing point of debate within Indian mandate to replace personal laws based on the scriptures and customs of each major religious community in India with a common set of rules governing every citizen. In India the purpose of Uniform Civil code is to replace the personal laws based on the scriptures and customs of each major religious community in the country with a common set governing every citizen.

A uniform civil code will mean a set of common personal laws for all citizens. Currently, for example, there are different personal laws for Hindus and Muslims. Personal law covers property, marriage and divorce, inheritance and succession.

BEGINNING OF UNIFORM CIVIL CODE

The uniform civil code became a flashpoint in Indian politics in 1985 during the Shah Bano case. The Supreme Court had held that Bano, a Muslim woman, should get alimony from her ex-spouse. In the context of that judgment the court had said an uniform. Personal laws were first framed during the British Raj, mainly for Hindu and Muslim citizens. The British feared opposition from community leaders and refrained from further interfering within this domestic .

The demand for a uniform civil code was first put forward by women activists in the beginning of the twentieth century, with the objective of women's rights, equality and secularism. Till Independence in 1947, a few law reforms were passed to improve the condition of women, especially Hindu widows. In 1956, the Indian Parliament passed Hindu Code Bill amidst significant opposition. Though a demand for a uniform civil code was made by Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, his supporters and women activists, they had to finally accept the compromise of it being added to the Directive Principles because of heavy opposition.

INDIAN CONSTITUTION ON UNIFORM CIVIL CODE

The constitution has a provision for Uniform Civil Code in Article 44 as a Directive Principle of State Policy which states that The State shall endeavor to secure for the citizens a uniform civil code throughout the territory of India.

There are a number of cases where the Supreme Court has referred to Article 44 and the concept of uniform civil code, mainly to highlight the lacklustre attitude of the executive and the legislature in the implementation of the directive.

Article 44 of the Constitution calls upon the State to endeavour towards securing a uniform civil code throughout the territory of India. It falls within Part IV of the Constitution titled as Directive Principles of State Policy (DPSP) and understood as exhortations to the State to be kept in mind while governing the country.

OBJECTIVE OF THIS SEMINAR ON UCC

The main motive of this Seminar is to further productive discussions on the issues relating to the family and marriage, and the laws pertaining to them. It also aims to explore the possibility of incorporation of the Uniform Civil Code thereby bringing all religious and social groups under the purview of a typical stage, which is currently lacking due to the administration of differing laws in the area. The Seminar also aspires to explore the role of the Uniform Civil Code in newer dimensions, and in light of the issues currently faced by the society
