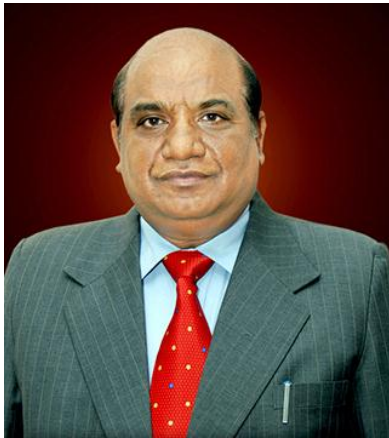

Dr. Pragati Kapoor Assoc. Dean (Academics) explained the case in details as per the agenda note. The academic

Council approved the action proposed as given below:

1. Duration of the course will be six years comprising of 12 semesters.
2. There will be internship of one semester in the 12th semester.
3. The total credit of the scheme will be approximately 300.
4. Total credits to obtain the degree will be minimum 280.
5. The students shall be issued two certificates– three year Diploma corresponding to first three years of the programme and three years lateral entry B.Tech degree corresponding to last three years of the programme.

The Academic Council also approved the scheme of study for 10th, 11th and 12th semester as proposed in the agenda note.

It was further clarified that the nomenclature of the this programme is **Integrated B.Tech** and on completion of the 12 semester course successfully with required earned credits with required CGPA, the concerned students will be getting the B.Tech degree in respective branch and he will be issued transcript and DMC's accordingly.

However due to some reason after completion of three years, if any student does not want to complete the I.B.Tech programme of 12 semesters and opts for permanent exit then he will be awarded Diploma subject to the condition that he has earned 150 credits with required CGPA. In that case his all the previous DMC's will be withdrawn and the same will be replaced by the fresh DMC's for award of Diploma in respective branch and the column against the nomenclature of the I.B.Tech programme will not be indicated.

Item No. 15.5 Changes in the PhD regulations in view of the new UGC PhD regulations 2016" w.e.f from Even number Session of academic year (2016-17) i.e. January 2017.

Dr. G.V. Ramaraju, PVC (R&D) explained the details of the modifications in PhD. audiences as per the agenda note.

The Academic Council after discussion approved the same.

Item No. 15.6 To consider the modified regulations of PCI to be implemented on Batch 2017 of B.Pharmacy

For example, to be declared as PASS and to get grade, the student has to secure a minimum of 50 marks for the total of 100 including continuous mode of assessment and end semester theory examination and has to secure a minimum of 25 marks for the total 50 including internal assessment and end semester practical examination.

**POLICY AND PROCEDURES TO MAINTAIN AND UTILIZE PHYSICAL
AND ACADEMIC SUPPORT FACILITIES IN THE CAMPUS**

- The Lingaya's Vidyapeeth has a defined process, procedures and monitoring mechanisms to ensure proper maintenance and utilization of infrastructure, library, sports, laboratories, classrooms, seminar halls, auditoriums, lifts and other service installations.
- The academic requirements in classrooms, laboratories and other infrastructural resources are identified at the start of each semester. The Labs catering to the needs are provided with advanced computers with LAN and Internet with Wi-Fi access. All repair, maintenance and upkeeps of labs are maintained by their lab in-charges/technical support. Maintenance work is undertaken during weekend on the basis of periodical report.
- Library: library has a good collection of Text Books, Reference Books, journals, magazines, etc. A provision of the budget for the library maintenance is made by the management. Faculty recommends the desired titles to the library and are procured from time to time. In addition, the library at Departmental level fulfil the specific needs of students and teachers.
- Transport: The University has a transport facility managed by administration to ensure the buses, vans, ambulances and cars are maintained properly efficiently. Ambulance is available in the campus 24 X 7 for students and faculty to meet any emergency.
- Work Shops: Periodic report on requirement of repairs and maintenance in Workshop are raised by the departments and forwarded to Administration office for compliance.
- Sports Complex: • Various sports facilities are available and being used regularly for competitions practice. The indoor and outdoor game are facilities regularly monitored and reports are submitted to Manager administration for its upkeep, repairs and maintenance.
- Computers: An IT cell headed by a senior member to oversee the procurement, maintenance, repairs and replacement of digitalized systems like computers, laptops, projectors, audio -visual devices etc.

There are adequate number of the latest configuration computers with internet connections, Wi-Fi facility, connected through LAN and the utility software's installed in administrative offices, department laboratories, library etc. Hi-Tech Surveillance System with HD cameras along with day/night facility recording in a control room and maintained by IT.

- Classrooms: An emphasizes on quality class room with all the basic facilities like fans, lights, proper furniture and ventilation etc along with separate girls' and boys' common room and medical centre. An impressive air-conditioned auditorium 1500 capacity managed by Manager Administration boosts for academic functions and cultural events. All classrooms are cleaned on regular basis by housekeeping department. The supervisors of the building are also responsible for the maintenance of the buildings and physical facilities.
- Electrical Maintenance: • A department for monitoring the power distribution system. 11 KVA substation, Gensets 720KVA, solar panel 250KW etc. are undertaken as per the maintenance schedule.

For the Students coming from the Government/ Government aided institutions and having 65% or more marks in the qualifying examination are eligible for Scholarship of 25% in the tuition fees.

10) For B.Tech (Lateral Entry to 2nd year)

Students coming from the Government/ Government aided institutions and having 65% or more marks in qualifying examination are eligible for scholarship of 50%

of total fees.

However during first year these students are required to pay one time charge of 7,500/- for Caution money, Blazer & tool kit.

11) Sports Scholarship

25% waiver in tuition fee will be given to the students who had participated in State/National/International level games.

(Applicable for only general education stream)

12) Alumni Scholarship

The students of entire Lingaya's group, who seek admission in Lingaya's University after qualifying 10+2/degree / diploma will be provided scholarship equivalent to 25% of the tuition fee for entire duration of the course for pursuing his/her 2nd degree from Lingaya's University.

13) Alumni Recommendation (Blood Relation)

25% waiver in tuition fee in all the courses for the entire duration of course will be given to candidates recommended by our Alumni.(only applicable for blood relation)

14) Alumni Recommendation (Others)

15% waiver in tuition fee in all the courses for the entire duration of course will be given to candidates recommended by our Alumni.(applicable for candidates other than blood relation)

15) Faculty / Staff Scholarship (Blood Relation)

25% waiver in tuition fee in all the courses for the entire duration of course will be given to candidates recommended by our Faculty/Staff.(only applicable for blood relation)

16) Sibling Scholarship

Lingaya's University offers a waiver of 25% in tuition fee to one of the siblings studying in our University.(Till both the siblings are studying in the university)

Pre-requisite condition for continuation of Scholarship / Tuition Fee Waiver is as under

1. Preferably no backlogs at the end of the academic year. In case of all clear with 7+ CGPA, an additional 10% of tuition Fee will be given scholarship.
2. There should not be any disciplinary action taken against the student.
3. More than 75% of attendance is must.
4. The student is not detained from appearing in the End Semester Examination due to any reason whatsoever.
5. A student will be eligible to get only one scholarship /tuition waiver at any time during the tenure of his/her stay for program he/she is admitted to.
6. The fee as prescribed by the university is submitted on or before the prescribed date.
7. He/She is not involved in any illegal activity / groupism / unionism.

In case of non-fulfillment of any of the above condition, the scholarship will not be continued under any circumstances and no request for continuation of the scholarship shall be entertained.

NOTIFICATION

Whereas, the Central Government is empowered under Section 3 of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956 to declare, on the advice of the UGC, an Institution of higher learning as deemed to be University.

2. **And whereas**, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, the Central Government vide its Notification No.9-23/2005-U3 dated 05.01.2009, on the advice of UGC, had declared Lingaya's Institute of Management & Technology, Faridabad as deemed to be University in the name & style of 'Lingaya's University' for the provisional period of five years, with effect from the date on which the aforesaid Institute disaffiliates itself from its affiliating University viz. Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak, Haryana. This was subject to condition that the status of deemed to be University shall be confirmed after the period of 5 years based on the inspection and assessment report of UGC's Expert Review Committee and the recommendations of the UGC thereon.


3. **And whereas**, UGC is in the process of reviewing the functioning of Lingaya's University (Deemed to be University), Faridabad as required by this Ministry's Notification dated 05.01.2009.

4. **And further whereas**, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its judgment Order dated 03.11.2017 in Civil Appeal Nos. 17869-17870/2017 (arising out of SLP(C) Nos.19807-19808/2012) filed by Orissa Lift Irrigation Corp. Ltd Versus Rabi Sankar Patro & Ors. and Civil Appeal Nos.17902-17905/2017 (arising out of SLP C Nos.35793-96/2012) titled as Vijay Kumar & Ors Vs. Kartar Singh & Ors held that UGC shall take appropriate steps for implementing Section 23 of the UGC Act and restraining Deemed to be Universities from using the word 'University' within one month from today.

5. **And whereas**, Section 23 of the UGC Act, 1956 says "no institution, whether a corporate body or not, other than a University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act or a State Act shall be entitled to have the word "University" associated with its name in any manner whatsoever: Provided that nothing in this section shall, for a period of two years from the commencement of this Act, apply to an institution which, immediately before such commencement, had the word "University" associated with its name".

6. **Now, therefore**, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, the Central Government, as per direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court, and on the advice of the UGC, do hereby change the name of "Lingaya's University", Faridabad, Haryana to "Lingaya's Vidyapeeth" by replacing the word 'University' with 'Vidyapeeth' w.e.f. the issuance of this Notification. "Lingaya's Vidyapeeth" shall not use the word 'University' suffixed to its name but may mention the words "deemed to be university" within parenthesis suffixed thereto.

7. The other conditions mentioned in the earlier Notification dated 05.01.2009 shall continue to be adhered by "Lingaya's Vidyapeeth".


